

Call to Order. Gus called the meeting to order at 6:37 pm.

Minutes: The minutes of the March 3rd, meeting were distributed to the membership for review. Gus asked for any changes, additions or corrections; there were none. Lisa moved to accept the minutes. Bonnie seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report: The treasurer's report showing the savings account balance and checking account activity from 01/01/22 through 3/30/22 was distributed to the membership for review. Jerry said that the March Pancake Breakfast was well attended. He stated that we are in a good financial position to cover the expenses associated with putting on the Fair. Annual Request to Township. Janine read Sue's report from the Township meeting. At the Township meeting a motion was made and carried that increased the amount of labor provided to the Fair, and the Babbitt Lion's Club was given permission to apply for a liquor license for the Fair.

In addition, she asked the membership if political candidates could rent space at the Fair and it was agreed that they could. She also said that she and Sue would be following up with information on Festival.net at the next meeting.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>: It was verified that ERFA owns the dunk tank. There will not be a Queen competition again this year.

Lisa made a motion to adjourn. Gus seconded. Motion carried. Gus adjourned the meeting at 7:56 pm.
